Objectives

This shift raises concerns among scientists about the suitability of traditional strategies designed to rationalize and forecast complex environments for today's multifaceted interactions. Resilience research prospects assume that evolution's uncertainty, crises, and transformative changes are natural. Thus, the focus shifts from protecting against difficulties to learning to manage and coexist with them. Resilience also emphasizes the need for transformative reconfigurations of the economies to prepare, anticipate, adapt, and leverage novel experiences for a competitive edge. Hence, we invite researchers to share their insights on enhancing economic resilience and being ready to tackle new challenges that await us.

The objectives of the Special Interest Working Group on Prospects for Resilient Economies in the Face of Uncertainty can be indicated, but not limited, as follows:

- Expand the knowledge and understanding of the resilience phenomenon at macro, micro and mezo levels
- Develop an international and interdisciplinary network
- Explore possibilities to apply for project grants
- Hold a Special session at the EBEEC 2025
